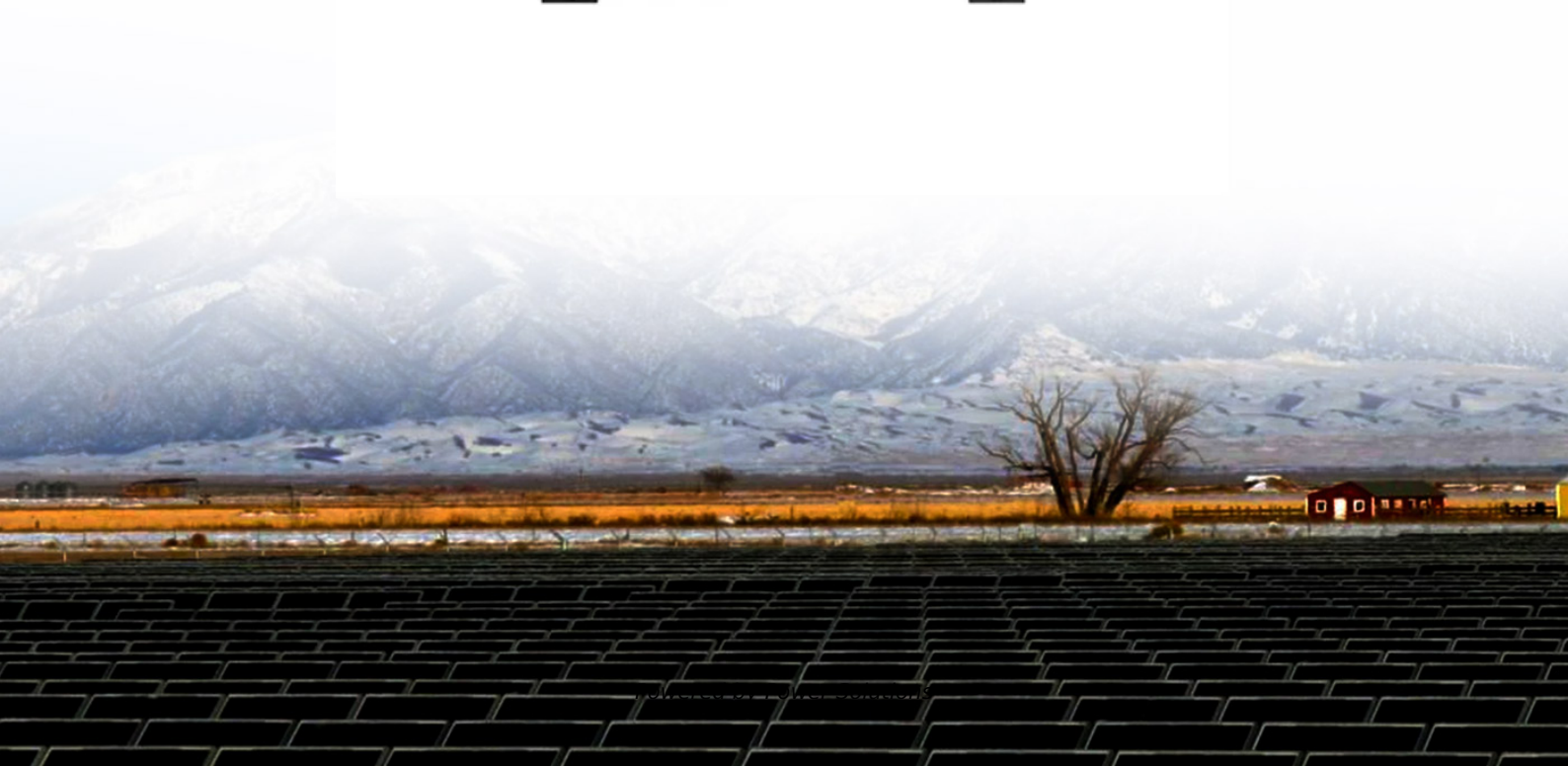

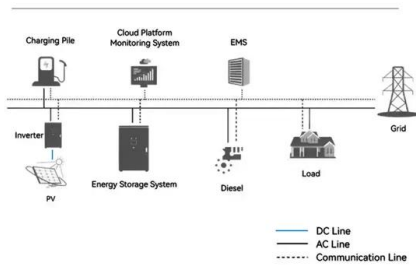

System Topology

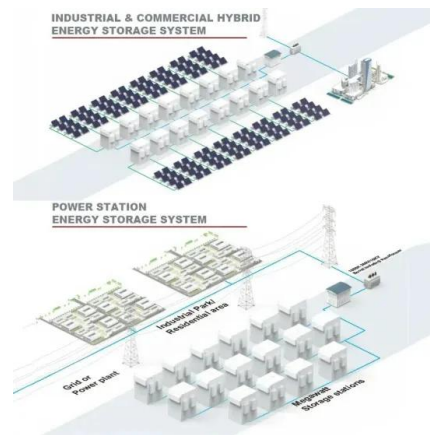


single word requests
